



## Criteria for Musicians

- Candidates must be minimum AMEB grade 3 or equivalent for strings, brass or woodwind and minimum AMEB grade 4 or equivalent for piano.
- Strings, brass and woodwind candidates can perform with an accompanist if the repertoire is intended to be played this way.
- Candidates can perform with a CD backing.
- Successful candidates will be expected to do Music as a subject from Years 8 to 12.
- Candidates will be expected to take part in the co-curricular program at Westminster School. They will be expected to participate in the program from Years 8 to 12 in at least 2 ensembles, but preferably a willingness to do more.
- If a candidate can play two or more instruments they are encouraged to audition on all.

### *Audition Requirements*

Musicians will be required to perform one piece on each instrument they can play.

## Criteria for Dancers

- Students will be invited to participate in a contemporary dance class (approximately 1 hour), at the Westminster Dance Studio.
- Students will be assessed in contemporary dance incorporating classical movements.
- Students will be expected to respond to the direction and instruction of the Westminster Dance teachers.
- A prepared dance repertoire is not required for Scholarship assessment.
- Successful candidates will be expected to do Dance as a subject from Years 7 to 12.
- Successful candidates will be expected to take part in the Co-curricular Dance program at Westminster. They will be expected to participate in the program from Years 7 to 12, attending at least two weekly dance classes.

### *Audition Requirements*

Students attending the Dance audition must wear appropriate attire, with hair off the face and bare feet, and bring a water bottle. The class will consist of contemporary technique, improvisation and a brief interview. No prepared solo is required.

## Review

The Scholarship winner is subject to an annual review. The annual review is conducted by either the Director of Music or Head of Dance, as applicable, and a nominated delegate. The student will be reviewed on their quality of music or dance performance, academic achievement and general participation in the Westminster Performing Arts program. A report will be submitted to the Head of Senior School. Students accepting the Fricker Scholarship with more than one discipline (drama, dance, music) are also expected to undertake, where possible given timetable constraints, other performing arts disciplines as a subject, and engage in performances. Student's academic achievement in these areas, as well as in other subjects, will be considered in the review process. Students are expected to achieve well in Performing Arts areas.
